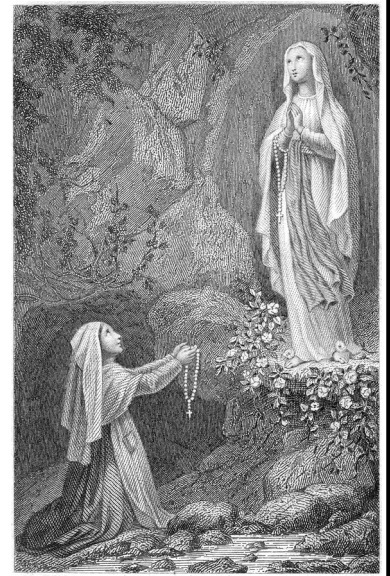

IN SHAKESPEARE'S PLAY, *Romeo and Juliet*, the latter asks: *What's in a name?* Well, for the God the Father, there is much in a name, especially in the Name given to His Divine Son become Man. The origin of our dear Lord's Name is from heaven. The angels revealed it to Mary first, and then to good St. Joseph. It was the Eternal Father who gave this perfect and identifying Name to His Divine Son for, as the Gospels state, *The Son no one knoweth but the Father*. Hence, the Father alone was able to provide a truly appropriate Name. The Father wished, as St. Paul tells us, to exalt His Son in the same proportion that He humbled Himself in the mysteries of the Incarnation and His Most Sorrowful Passion. By His infinite condescension, by the annihilation of the Incarnation, the Son immensely glorified His Father. In recompense for this loving act, the Father named Him Jesus: *At the Name of Jesus every knee shall bend, of those in heaven, on earth, and under the earth; and let every tongue confess that Jesus Christ is Lord to the glory of God the Father - for there is no other Name under heaven given to men whereby we must be saved - for He shall save His People from their sins*. We ought to bow our heads low, therefore, at the mention of this heaven sent Name, Jesus, for It is the Name given to the Son of God in the Human Nature He took up.
